

Leeds and Jefferson Heights  
Sewer Project  
Frequently Asked Questions (FAQ) Issue #2

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**Has construction started? Where is it happening and when will it be in my neighborhood?** Construction of sewer lines have begun. The contractor is beginning to install the sewer lines on Route 23B and in the neighborhoods in Jefferson Heights. Work will advance from Jefferson Heights towards the Thruway crossing this fall. Construction in Leeds is not anticipated until 2017. Construction advances every day so if you see crews near your street, you can expect construction in your area in the near future.

**The construction crew cut through my driveway and lawn. They put stone and dirt (crusher run) back in the hole then moved on. What happens next?** Restoration of pavement and grassed areas will occur as soon as possible. However, in some areas, coordination with Central Hudson is required for installation of upgraded or new gas lines, so it is not possible to predict exactly when restoration will occur. The contractor is responsible to ensure that grass is grown in after restoration and that process may take some time so patience is urged.

**I'm being asked where I want my 'stub' installed. What is that?** The stub is a connection from the sewer main to your property line. Your plumber will run a line from your building to the stub so the location should be where it makes the most sense to you and won't be in the way of any future construction on your property.

**I received a letter stating that a grinder pump will be installed on my property and an easement is needed. What is this about?**

In some locations, it is not possible to connect buildings to the sewer system by gravity pipes, so small pumps are needed to convey the wastewater to the sewer mains. These pumps will be installed as part of the project, so easements are needed from some property owners to allow the installation to occur now and for future maintenance access. Please follow the instructions in the letter in executing the easement or contact us if you have questions or need more information.
