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Resolution No. 9-24

SEQRA Declaration And Approving Recommendations For Including Land Into Agricultural District No. 124

WHEREAS, in accordance with Article 25-A, § 303-b of the Agriculture and Markets Law of New York State the Greene County Legislature has designated an annual thirty-day period as November 1st through November 30th within which a landowner may submit a request for inclusion of land which is predominately viable agricultural land within an Agricultural District prior to the county established review period; and

WHEREAS, upon the termination of such thirty-day period the County Legislative Body shall follow the procedure proscribed by Article 25-A, § 303-b of the Agriculture and Markets Law of New York State; and

WHEREAS, the Greene County Agricultural and Farmland Protection Board has compiled a report of its recommendations as to whether one (1) parcel of land be included in the agricultural district as consisting of predominantly viable agricultural land as well as parcel mergers within the district and serving the public interest by assisting in maintaining a viable agricultural industry within the district; and

WHEREAS, a Public Hearing was held by the Greene County Legislature on January 17, 2023; and

WHEREAS, the Greene County Legislature has considered factors contained in Article 25-A, § 303-b of the Agriculture and Markets Law and of 6 NYCRR Part 617 (State Environmental Quality Review), with respect to said district and proposed additions.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that after due deliberation and pursuant to the Agriculture and Markets Law, the Greene County Legislature hereby determines that the amendment to Agricultural District No. 124 recommended by the Greene County Agricultural and Farmland Protection Board will not have a significant adverse environmental impact and therefore an Environmental Impact Statement is not required; and be it further

RESOLVED, that the Greene County Legislature hereby approves the modifications to Agricultural District No. 124 as recommended by the Greene County Agricultural and Farmland Protection Board, consisting of one (1) parcels of land.




